AMENDMENT TO THE REVISED DISCHARGE GUIDELINES FOR COVID-19 PATIENTS DATED 1st July 2020

No. 31/ F2/2020/H&FWD- 21st July 2020

The COVID-19 pandemic is evolving and clinical research data is revealing new knowledge into the epidemiology of the disease. It is essential that the technical strategies and guidelines are refined based on the new knowledge for control and prevention of the disease as well as for the efficient resource management. Based on the recent analysis of the epidemiology of the patients in Kerala and considering the guidelines of the World Health Organization (WHO) and Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India, the revised discharge guideline for COVID-19 patients is issued. The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt of India guidelines stipulates to discharge asymptomatic patients on the 10th day.

a. The discharge policy is amended as follows –

All Positive patients will be subjected to Antigen test as follows and take further actions regarding the discharge accordingly.
